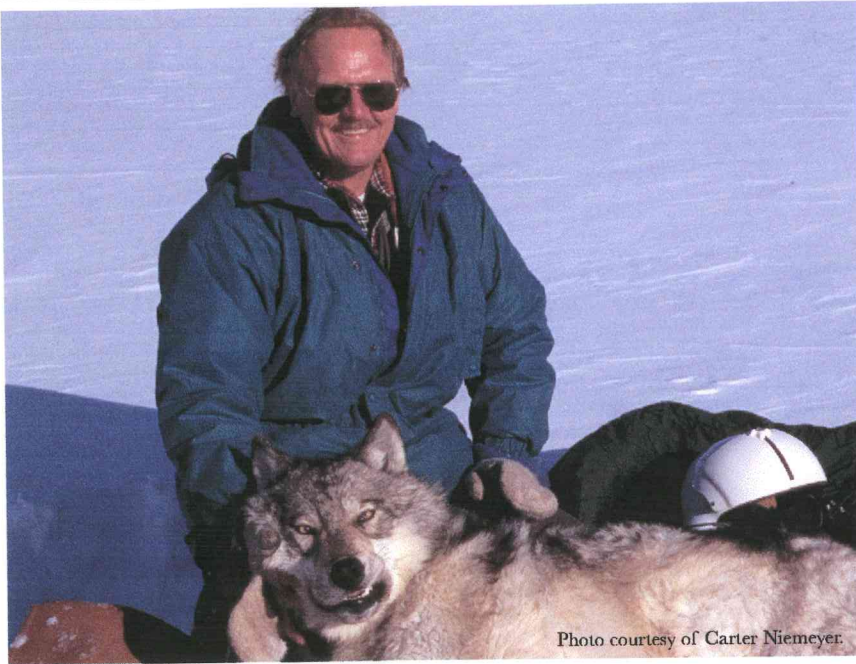

The Siskiyou County Department of Agriculture wants you to have the facts so you know what to expect if wolves become established in southern Oregon and northern California.

CARTER NIEMEYER, an expert in wolf biology and a leading authority on wolves, will be in Yreka on May 10th to inform the public on wolf behavior, wolf predation on livestock and his wolf management experience in Montana and Idaho.

- Carter is well informed on the Endangered Species Act. He spent many years working for the Department of Wildlife Services in Montana controlling predatory animals and protecting livestock.
- He also worked for the US Fish and Wildlife Service and helped develop wolf management plans in Idaho and Oregon.
- Carter will give a presentation on wolf behavior, wolf impacts on elk and deer populations, and procedures he used to confirm wolf kills on livestock.
- He will also answer specific questions from the audience regarding wolf management and the potential impact on the local livestock industry.
